"The first speaker was Mr. Otto E. Huiswoud, 206 West 133d Street, New York City, who saids 'A little over a year ago I was just back from Russia. I attented the Fourth Congress of the Third International. Mr. Claude McKay and I were there together and Mr. McKay got so enthused with the country that he said he was not coming to this country until the revolution was over in America; that there was no discrimination in that country; that he had been in meetings with Mr. Lenin and he was the same Lenin every day. He said that it was Lenin that said to Mr. John Reed: 'What wre we doing for the American Negro. The American Negro has no more right to be in bondage than the Jew in Russia.'"



The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect that OTTO EDUARD HUISWOUD, last residence 408 West 128th Street, New York City, Alien Registration #4892607, is a Negro citizen of Dutch Guiana. Inasmuch as there is no record of anyone with the name spelled HOUISWOUID or HOUISEWOOD, it is felt this person is identical with the one mentioned in the Bureau memorandum.

OTTO EDUARD HUISWOUD was born October 28, 1893 at Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana, Province of Surinan, and is a citizen of Holland. He left New York January 15, 1941 on the SS "PYGMALTON" and there is no application on file for a reentry permit. His description is given as follows:

> Male Sex Race Negro ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED Height 516m HEREIN IS UNCLASSIFIED Weight 155 Black Hair Eyes Brown Marital status Married; no children

He has lived at the following addresses in New York City: 450 Mott Avenue; 2800 Bronx Park East, U-54; 408 West 128th Street. He was employed by W. ANDOMINGO at 110 West 143rd Street. New York City, and also the Midtown Sectetarial Bureau, 2007 7th Avenue, New York City.

HUISWOUD first arrived at the Port of New York March 1, 1923 on the "RYNDAM" and the original immigration information will be on file at that port. He entered as a permanent resident, expecting to reside permanently in the United States. When the Alien Enery Registration form was filled out December 23 1940 HUISWOUD stated he had lived a total of 17 years in the United States.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service Reentry Permit file discloses that he left New York March 9, 1929 for Holland and Germany to travel and study. He reentered at New York June 14, 1929, Application #459528, Reentry Permit #457641. He again left New York City July 20, 1929

to go to the West Indies on business, returning to New York City September 16, 1929, Application #520483, Reentry Permit #514626. He left New York City February 19, 1930 to go to Jamaica and Dutch Guiana on business, returning June 17, 1930 to New York, Application #568792, Reentry Permit #565123. At the time HUISWOUD made these trips he was in the employ of W. A. DOMINGO.

In the Alien Registration application HUISWOUD also stated he had no memberships in any clubs, no military service, was never arrested or indicted for conviction of any offense, and within the past five years had not been affiliated with, or active in any organization devoted in whole or in part to influencing or furthering the political activities, public relations or public policies of a foreign government. He also said he had not applied for United States citizenship papers.

HERMINA/HUISWOUD, wife of OTTO HUISWOUD, mailed his Alien Rnemy Registration card back to the Immigration and Naturalization Service with the statement that he had left New York January 15, 1941 on the SS "FYGMALION."

In order to assist New York in tracing HUISWOUD, the following information is being set out on his wife:

DETAILS:

Investigation in this matter was predicated upon information be received from Confidential Informate whose identity is known to by the Bureau, who stated that HUISWOUD was an international courier employed by the OGPU. Inasmuch as there appears to be no former report consolidating and setting forth background information concerning subject, there is being hereinafter set forth in chronological order, insofar as is practicable, information regarding his past activities as obtained from a review of the files in the New York Field Division.

OTTO HUISWOUD, negro, was born October 28, 1893 at Paramaribo, Surinam, Dutch Guiana, and is a citizen of Holland.

He is reported to have joined the Communist Party in 1919 (Gitlew's book "I Confess", page 522) or 1921 and on March 1, 1923 first entered the United States on the wessel "Ryndam" as a permanent resident, at that time declaring his intention of residing in this country permanently. In that year, according to substantiated by an announcement made shortly after his arrival that one OTTO HOUISEWOOD, "a prominent member of the Blood Brotherhood and also a member of the Workers Party of America", would speak on March 25, 1923 at the Machinist Temple, 1239 Spring Garden Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on "the eppression of negroes in America", as set forth in reference Bureau letter dated September 22, 1944.

By 1924 subject had become of such importance in the Party that in a report dated at Chicago on July 15, 1924, entitled "General Communist Activities", an unnamed confidential source was credited with reporting that:

Workers Party of America, with headquarters in Chicago, was ordered to return to New York to remain there indefinitely. He left for his destination on June 28 (1924). Before leaving he placed one of his supporters in one of the Chicago divisions of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and I am informed that the Central Executive Committee directed him to get in touch with his undercoverman and find out what steps have been taken by the local division toward selecting delegates to the 4th convention of the Universal Negro and Imprevement Association to be held in New York commencing August 1 (1924) so that the national office of the Workers Party can cutline a course of action

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wand prepare propaganda for dissemination among the delegates. This secret agent reported that the election of delegates to the Garvey convention would be taken up at the meeting of the division at 3335 South State Street on July 2 and promised to send the names to HUISWOUD as soon as they were chosen **

Shortly thereafter, as set forth in the report of Special Agent John L. Haas, dated June 20, 1925 at New York, entitled "Special Report of Radical Activities in the Greater New York District for Period Month Ending June 30, 1925", an unnamed confidential informant who was also a member of the Negro Branch of the Communist Party, advised that: "OTTO HUISWODE is now in New York City acting as organizer of negro Communistic groups. This work is said to be financed with funds from Moscow through the Workers Party."

In the report of Special Agent George J. Starr, dated August 18, 1925 at Chicago, entitled "Workers Party of America, General Investigation", one THEODORE BURRELL is quoted as advising that:

** OTTO HUTSWOUD of the African Bleed Brotherhood, who is very prominent in organizing the (American Negro Labor) Congress, is a member of the Soviet Red Army and has in his possession a Red Army uniform.**

Attached to this same report was a photostatic copy of a letter from LOVETT FORT-WHITMAN to AUBREY CLIFFORD MATLEY on the letterhead of the American Negro Congress, on which is printed a list of a "Provisional Committee for Organizing American Negro Congress", under which appears: "OTTO HUISWOUD, African Blood Brotherhood, New York City".

On September 30, 1926 subject married HERMINA MERMY" ALICIA DUMONT of New York City. She is reported to have been born in New Amsterdam, British Guiana on October 8, 1905 and to have entered the United States November 5, 1919 as a passenger on the "Korona" at New York City, thereafter becoming a citizen of this country by naturalization in the Bronx County, New York Supreme Court on February 17, 1928, receiving naturalization certificate #2703971. She is variously reported by to have been seen in the Lenin University in Confidential Informant Moscow, to have worked with her husband on a negro left wing trade union paper in Hamburg, Germany; to have made various trips for the Communist Political Association to Russia, Haiti and South America; to have frequented the State and National headquarters of the Communist Party during the period 1936 to 1942; to have been the 1940-1941 Executive Secretary of the Communist Party unit on 125th Street and 8th Avenue in New York City: to have been seen at the headquarters of the Washington Carver School and of the American Labor Party; to have attended meetings in support of Adam Clayton Powell; to have been active in the Negro Labor Victory Committee;

and to have been working for the Collins Committee. She is presently reported to be residing at apartment 20, 408 W. 128th Street, New York City.

 On August 29, 1942
submitted information to the effect that OTTO
HUISWOUD was a member of the National Election Campaign Committee of the
Workers Communist Party in 1928, as well as a member of the American
Workers Communist Party, the International Labor Defense, and the Inter-
 national Labor Aid, and was contributing editor of the "Negro Champion",
official organ of the American Negro Labor Congress.

In 1928, as reported by subject was elected an alternate member of the Executive Committee of the Communist International, and in 1929 as a charter member of the Communist Party Boston delegation, signed an appeal sent by the National Convention of the Communist Party of the United States of America to Moscow.

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As set forth in the report of Special Agent dated at New York, January 10, 1944, entitled "New York Workers School; Internal Security - C", the 1928-1929 "Announcment of Courses" set forth among those listed as officers of the (New York) Workers School and a member of the National Advisory Committee, the name of OTTO HUISWOUD.

In February 1929, as set forth on pages 522, 523 of BENJAMIN GITIOW's book "I Confess", published in 1940 by E. P. Dutton Company, Inc.: "The proletarian chosen by the (national) convention (at New York City to) — appealed to the Comintern against its decisions on the American (Communist) Party —— consisted of —— OTTO HUISWOUD, a negro Communist, who had been a paid Party official almost from the organization of the Party in 1919 each one of them was a native born American with the exception of HUISWOUD who was a West Indian. However, being a negro was considered a mark of distinction among us."

Such a trip is reflected in the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Philadelphia, which revealed that on March 9, 1929 HUISWOUD left New York allegedly for the purpose of travelling and studying in Holland and Germany, and that he re-entered the United States at New York City on June 14, 1929 by virtue of re-entry permit #457641, application #459528. Immigration and Naturalization Service records further reflect that on July 20, 1929 he again departed from New York for the purported purpose of going to the West Indies on business. This trip was apparently made in his capacity as a Cominterm agent inasmuch as on page 173 of the book "Harlem: Negro Metropolism, by CIAUDE MC KAY, published in 1940 by E. P. Dutton & Company, Inc., the author in speaking of the International Convention of Negroes in Jamaica in 1929, organized by the negro leader, MARCUS AURELIUS GARVEY, writes: "The Communist Party sent its



whether megroes should join the Cominter. Garvey took up the challenge and speaking on the negative side, won overwhelmingly. This is substantiated by information received from that: "HUISWOUD is known to have definite connections with Jamaica. In 1929 he attended the Universal Negro Improvement Association conference there as a delegate from the U.S.A. and later started a Jamaica trade or labor union which subsequently died through lack of support."

Returning from Jamaica HUISWOUD again re-entered the United States at New York on September 16, 1929 by virtue of re-entry permit #514626, application #520483, as reflected in the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Philadelphia. However, on February 19, 1930 he again departed from the port of New York for the expressed purpose of going to Jamaica and Dutch Guiana on business for W. A. DOMINGO, 110 W. 143rd Street, New York City, in whose employ he had similarly claimed to he on former departures from the United States.

and his wife in Trinidad from Jamaica on April 11, 1930, he claimed to be travelling as the representative of the American Negro: Labor Congress of New York, for the Correct of getting representatives to attend the London conference in July. In Trinidad subject was discovered to be a dangerous Belshevik and Communist agitator and was in consequence ordered by the Inspector General of Constabulary to leave the colony at the earliest possible moment, whereupon he and his wife left Trinidad for Paramaribo Surinam, on April 28, 1930. The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect his re-entry in the United States at New York on June 17, 1930, but contain no record of his subsequent departure until January 15, 1941.

However, according to the testimony of WILLIAM ODELL NOWEIL, negro, and former high-ranking Detreit Communist, before the Committee on Un-American Activities on July 29, 1939, as set forth in the report of Special Agent dated July 20, 1942 at New York, captioned "Communist Party, USA, Voorhis Act", HUISWOUD was one of the 26 individuals sent from the United States in 1931 to enter the International Lenin University in Moscow.

advised that in 1931 the subject was working in the Negro Bureau of the Red International of Labor Unions in Moscow where he is also reported to have been seen in 1932 by Confidential Informant This has confirmation in the further statement of WILLIAM ODELL NOWELL as set forth in the report of Special Agent dated October 18, 1940 at Detroit, and entitled "Harry Renton Bridges, Communist Activities; Immigration Matter", to the effect that:

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In the fall of 1931, among American Communist leaders assigned to the Comintern and the Red International of Labor Unions (RIII) was OTTO HUISWOUD, negro of New York."

Starr at New York, dated May 18, 1940 and captioned "Communist Party, USA, Voorhis Act", stated that OTTO HUISWOUD, who also used the name BILLINGS, was travelling for the OGPU in the British colenies under an illegal United States passport.

When subsequently interviewed on October 21, 1941 at Bureau request (Bureau letter to Chicago dated September 11, 1941), as set forth in the report of Special Agent George J. Starr, dated April 27, 1942 at New York, MALKIN stated that HUISWOUD had also used the name of WOODSEN and was a friend of LOVETT FORT-WHITMAN, as well as the writer of many articles for the Daily Worker. He stated that the subject had been in the United States in 1940 but was now out of the country and suggested that CIAUDE MC KAY, negro poet, be contacted inasmuch as he had been acquainted with the subject. HUISWOUD's presence in the United States during this period is confirmed by confidentially received information set



out in Bureau letter to all field offices dated October 21, 1941, entitled "Communist Party, USA; Voerhis Act", to the effect that among persons listed as having attended the 11th National Convention at New York City on May 30, 1940 to June 2, 1940 as official delegates was "OTTO HUISWOUD (negro) - He is from New York and is reported to represent Jamaica,"

As reflected in the files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Philadelphia, as set forth in Philadelphia letter dated September 29, 1944, the subject received alien registration #4892607, his alien enemy registration form dated December 23, 1940 reflecting he had lived a total of 17 years in the United States. He also stated that he had no membership in any clubs, no military service, was never arrested or indicted for commission of any offense, and within the past five years had not been affiliated with or active in any organization devoted in whole or in part to influencing or furthering the political activities, public relations or public policies of a foreign government. He also stated that he has not applied for United States citizenship papers.

The files further reflect that HERMINA HUISWOUD, subject's wife, mailed his alien enemy registration card back to the Immigration and Naturalization Service with the statement that he had left New York January 15, 1941 on the SS Pygmalion. This was confirmed by a check at the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Ellis Island, New York, by Special Agent which reflected on outgoing manifest #8170 that the SS Pygmalion had sailed from the port of New York on January 15, 1941 bound for the ports of Trinidad and Paramaribo. OTTO E. HUISWOUD, age 47, who stated that he had last entered the United States on June 15, 1930, was listed as a passenger enroute to live in Paramaribo, Netherlands Guiana.

Through it was ascertained that subject had stated that he was enroute to Keizerstratt 17, Paramaribo, byc Surinam, Dutch Guiana, where he expected to visit his family concerning a settlement of family property. At that time the subject advised that he had in the past been employed in the sale of tropical produce for the Mando Trading Company of 223 W. 143rd Street, New York, but for several months prior to his departure from the United States on January 15, 1941 had been unemployed. He advised that he had formerly taken a part in politics supporting the Democrats and the Socialists but was no longer interested. While aboard the Pygmalion subject was found to be in possession of a travel document issued by the Consul General of the Netherlands at New York to OTTO EDUARD GERARDUS MAJELLA HUISWOOD, born in Paramaribo, Surinam on October 28, 1893, which showed his address as 408 W. 128th Street, New York. This case was reopened pursuant to Bureau letter of July 22, 1947, wherein it was noted that as a result of an interview with which interview was conducted for the purpose of obtaining from him information regarding individuals who might furnish information as to the early history of the Communist Party, the name of OTTO HUISWOOD was suggested by

The New York files failed to indicate that HUISWOOD has severed his relations with the Communist Farty. The last information on the b2 subject was a letter made available by Confidential Informant dated b71 April 9, 1947, which was addressed to COMRADE from ISRAEL AMTER, wherein b6 AMTER said he had met HUISWOOD in Havana. AMTER related that HUISWOOD and b70 his wife desired to return to the Netherlands. MRS. HUISWOOD was understood by AMTER to be very active in the Communist Party.

Investigation at 408 West 128 Street, New York City, reflected that MRS. HUISWOOD is presently residing at that address in apartment 20-B under the name of H. DUMONT, which is her maiden name. Accordingly, a mail cover was placed against her name.

On September 6, 1947, an air mail letter was received by DUMONT which had been postmarked Paramaribo, September 2, 1947, reflecting the sender as HUISWOUD, Keizer Straat 17, Para Surinan. Letters reflecting the above address were also received by DUMONT on September 17, October () October 10, and October 21, 1947.

On October 23, 1947, a letter was received by DUMONT with the return address O. AUISWOOD. care of SS Cottica, postmarked Port au b6 Spain, Trinadad, BWI. Inspector Ships Movements Division of the U. S. Customs, New York City, advised that the SS Cottica sailed from Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana, on October 18, 1947, enroute to Amsterdam, Holland, where it was expected to arrive October 30, 1947. On November 20, 1947, a letter was received by DUMONT from HUISWOOD reflecting his return address as Grevelingen Straat 141, Amsterdam, Holland.

The mail cover also reflected that DUMONT received correspondence from the following:

ALICE DUMONT, and MISS HILDA OUDKERK. The date of Declaration of Intention (first papers) was June 2, 1924, at New York.

MR. IMKS. MRS. HUISWOUD stated in this petition that her husband was OTTO EDWARD HUISWOUD, who was born October 28, 1893, at Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana, and whom she married September 30, 1926. They have no children. She had resided continuously in the United States since November 5, 1919, and at the time of this petition, MRS. HUISWOUD stated that her husband was not naturalized.

DUMONT declared her intention to become a citizen (#57167) on June 2, 1937, in the Supreme Court of Queens County, New York, at Jamaica, New York. She stated that she was a widow, her husband's name having been HERMANN DUMON To whom she married August 2, 1898, at British Guiana. HERMANN DUMONT was bern in 1866 in British Guiana, and died 1908 in Guatemala, British Honduras, and had never been in the United States. One child, MRS. HERMINA A. HUISWOUD, resided with her. Her last foreign address was noted as Georgetown, British Guiana, and reflected that she lawfully entered the United States for permanent residence at New York City, on November 5, 1919, on the SS KORONA.

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The Petition for Naturalization #343996, was filed January 11, 1940, at the U. S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, and MRS. DUMONT was admitted to citizenship on May 10, 1940, at the same court.

The manifest reflected that MISS OUDKERK's mother, MRS. EDITH A. OUDKERK, resided at 71 Adelaide Street, Georgetown, British, Guiana, and she was destined to her father at 252 Adams Street, Brooklyn, New York.

The records reflected the Declaration of Intention #102420, filed December 4, 1925, in the U. S. District Court of the Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn, New York, for HILDA MILLICENT SPENCER, housewife, 15 St. Marks Place, Brooklyn, New York. This Declaration stated she entered the United States at New York City under the name HILDA M. OUDKERK on November 5, 1919, on the SS KORONA. She was described as having been born at Georgetown, British Guiana, August 8, 1898; married to WILLIAM SPENCER on October 16, 1925, at Bronx, New York; and there were no children. Her last foreign residence was noted as Georgetown, British Guiana. She stated that her husband was born in Georgetown, British Guiana, March 15, 1900, and had entered the United States at New York City on May 22,1923.



A check of the City Directory for Morristown, New Jersey, reflected that one, ERICH KATZENSTEIN and his wife, LOUISE KATZENSTEIN, reside at the Lincolnian Apartments, Apartment 309, 185 Speedwell Avenue, Morristown, New Jersey. The directory failed to show any individual named "EVIE" KATZENSTEIN residing at the above address. In view of the information appearing later in this report, it is believed that EVIE KATZENSTEIN, referred to in referenced report, is identical with ERICH KATZENSTEIN, who is listed as being employed as a clerk in the Food Fair Market, Morristown, New Jersey. His wife, LOUISE KATZENSTEIN, is employed as a corset fitter by the Greenberger Department Stores in Morristown, New Jersey.

Confidential Informants T-1 and T-2 advised that LOUISE KATZENSTEIN and her husband, ERICH, have resided in Morristown for approximately seven years. They arrived in the United States shortly before the war, being among a group of German-Jewish refugees who came over from England. IOUISE KATZENSTEIN has been employed at the Greenberger Department Store in Morristown, New Jersey for approximately seven years. She has never exhibited any tendencies which would indicate that she was in sympathy with the Communist Party and is regarded as a good worker and of good character. ERICH KATZENSTEIN, however, has the reputation of being a "negro lover." In this connection, Confidential Informant T-1 stated that KATZENSTEIN left his wife for a period of about a year, approximately a year ago, during which time he was reported to have been living with the colored woman in New York City. KATZENSTEIN has associated with very few individuals in Morristown, and most of his associates appear to be in New York. In this connection, KATZENSTEIN makes frequent trips to New York and is reported to be interested in the advancement of the colored race.

NK 100-30166

Informant T-1 stated that several years age an article appearing in a New York newspaper listed KATZENSTEIN as one of the speakers at a large meeting in Harlem which was held in connection with negro activities there, purportedly designed to assist in the advancement of the colored race. The informant could not recall the name of the newspaper or the date of the article. He further advised that he has heard that KATZENSTEIN has Communistic tendencies, but he could not furnide any definite information as to the source of this information. The informant stated that KATZENSTEIN and his wife had considerable marital difficulties over his association with the negro element. KATZENSTEIN is regarded by the informants as a rather queer individual who does not appear to follow the normal pattern of social activity in the community. He has no known associates in Morristown, New Jersey, and as stated above, appears to associate with individuals in New York City, the majority of whom are colored. The identity of these associates, however, was not known to the informants.

Morris County Court
House, Morristown, New Jersey, advised that IOUISE KATZINSTEIN was naturalized at Morristown on March 6, 1946, being issued Certificate No. 6474511. Her petition reflected that she was born January 2, 1902 at Berlin, Gormany, and her hasband, ERICH, was born March 11, 1905 at Cologne, Germany. They were married January 18, 1934 at Cologne, Germany, and Immigrated to the United States from Liverpool, England on January 3, 1940, arriving at New York City on the "SS Georgic."

The only record pertaining to ERICH and IOUISE KATZENSTEIN, which was found in the files of the Newark Bivision, was a record of an Enemy Alien registration. A check of various sources of information available to the Newark Division failed to reflect that either of these individuals is engaged in any known Communist activity in the State of New Jersey.







They held a lengthy meeting and decided to develop in the province of Las Villas more intense activities for the benefit of the Negroes. Likewise, they decided to prepare a great provincial plenary, and for this purpose they agreed to address circulars to all societies of the province of Las Villas that were composed of Negroes for the purpose of sending commissions to parade in front of the National Capitol and to demand that Congress pass a law against racial discrimination as an amendment to the Constitution and to be presented to the Senate by the Communist Senator SALVADOR CARCIA LIGHTO.

Dr. C. HERNANDEZ COBAU mentioned that he is receiving a great quantity of suggestions and proposals to be studied by the Executive Board and to be presented to the plenary of the Provincial Federation. Finally, he said that he was confident that all of these societies would answer in order to make the Federation stronger.





The entitled individual was born on October 28, 1893, in Parameribo, Province of Surinam, Dutch Guiana. Allegedly Huiswood first entered the United States on March 1, 1923, however, there is some information that his entry was prior to that time. On October 18, 1921, Otto Huiswood of the African Blood Brotherhood reportedly attached a meeting of the Workers League in New York City. It was also reported that Huiswood, whose Party name was Billings, attended a Communist meeting in New York City on January 7 and 8, 1922.

From November 7 until December 3, 1922, Huiswood served as a delegate to the Fourth Congress of the Communist International in Moscow using the name of J. Billings.

Information was received that in 1923 Otto Huiswood was the National Organizer of the African Blood Brotherhood and was a member of Section 4 of the Workers Party in Harlem, New York City.

haring the year 1924 Huiswood was reported to be active in the Workers Party in the Chicago area and in July of that year he allegedly was transferred from Chicago back to New York City.

In 1925 information was received that Huiswood was one of the organizers of the American Negro Labor Congress. In October of 1925, Huiswood wes elected a member of the General Executive Board of the Mational Negro Labor Congress.

In 1928 Huiswood was listed as a member of the National Advisory

Committee of the Norkers School and during the same year he served as a delegate
to the Sixth Congress of the Communist International held in Mescow and on
September 14, 1928, he was reported to have been elected an alternate on the
Executive Committee of the Communist International. During November and December,

1928, Huiswood was reported to have attended meetings of the Political Committee

From 1929 to 1938 he spent considerable time outside of the United States and in 1929 and 1930 he is reported to have sailed to Holland, Germany, Jamaica and Dutch Guiana on business. At the time he made the foregoing trips Huiswood stated that he was in the employ of W. A. Domingo. It is to be noted that Domingo, a Jamaican negro, has been reported as having been very active in Communist front organizations from 1919 to 1941, at which time he returned to Jamaica. Information has also been received that Domingo is alleged to have received training in Moscow during 1931.

Huiswood in 1931 was expelled from Jamaica by the Attorney General of the Netherlands West Indies and shortly thereafter he was expelled from the Port of Spain because he was considered a dangerous Communist.

According to the police at Trinidad, Huiswood was also known by the alias of Charles Woodson.

Sometime in 1931 or 1932 Huiswood is reported to have been in Mescow where he attended the Lenin School and while here he was alleged to be working for the Negro Eureau of the Red International of Labor Unions.

Information has been received that in 1933 he was sent from Moscow to Paris for the purpose of managing the publication, "Negro Worker". In 1934 Huiswood was reported to have been in charge of the International African Bureau in Berlin, Germany.

The "Negro Worker" issues of March, 1936, and March, 1937, published in Paris, France, disclose that its editor and chief was Charles Woodson and that it was the official organ of the International Trade Union Committee of the Negro Workers. According to the April 1, 1939, issue of the "Daily Worker", the official organ of the Communist Party, Charles Woodson "recently returned from eight years of study of the colonial question in various centers in Europe." According to this article, he was to be an instructor at the Harlem Peoples' School which was an affiliate of the Workers School.

Huiswood on May 31, 1940, is reported to have attended a secret session of the Eleventh National Convention of the Communist Party of the United States. Information has been received that Huiswood on July 17 and 18, 1940, attended a Communist conference at New York City on Latin American affairs.

He left the United States on January 15, 1941, and it was subsequently ascertained that he was intermed at Dutch Guians on January 31, 1941, and he was released from interment on September 25, 1942. His address at this time was Keizerstratt, 17, Paramaribo, Surinam, Dutch Guiana.



Maiswood was married to Herminia Alicia Huiswood, nee Dumont, in New York City on September 30, 1926. At the present time she resides at 408 West 125th Street, Apartment 21, New York City, and it has been established that she maintains a regular correspondence with her husband. A confidential source has advised that Mrs. Ruiswood is a well known Negro Communist who is allegedly active in international Communist matters. During the investigations of these individuals information was obtained which tended to indicate that Huiswood and his wife were aware of the creation of a Communist International Bureau or Coordinating Center in Paris, France, and that they were aware of the existence of such a group prior to the time that the Duclos criticism of the policies of Earl Browder was released. However, on July 13, 1927 a Petition for Naturalization under number 66774 was made by HERMINA ALICIA HUISWOUD, formerly known as HERMINA ALICIA DUMONT. Her residence was noted as 450 Mott Avenue, Bronx, New York, and her occupation as housewife. On this Petition she stated she was born October 8, 1905 in New Amsterdam, British Guiana. This file also reflected that Mrs. HUISWOUD had sailed from Georgetown, British Guiana, on October 23, 1919, on the SS KORONA and arrived in New York on November 5, 1919 with her mother, Mrs. ALICE DUMONT, and Miss HILDA OUDKERK. The date of Declaration of Intention (first papers) was June 2, 1924 at New York.

Mrs. HUISWOUD stated in this petition that her husband was OTTO EDWARD HUISWOUD, who was born October 28, 1893 at Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana and whom she married September 30, 1926. They have no children. She had resided continuously in the United States since November 5, 1919 and at the time of this petition, Mrs. HUISWOUD stated that her husband was not naturalized.

Certificate of Naturalization #2703971 was issued on February 17, 1928 in the Supreme Court Bronx County, New York, to HERMINA ALICIA HUISWOUD.

The records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflect that ALICE J DUMONT arrived on the SS KORONA on November 5, 1919, having sailed from Demerara, British Guiana, on October 22, 1919. The manifest described her as NY 100-105338.

Mrs. DUMONT declared her intention to become a citizen (#57167) on June 2, 1937 in the Supreme Court of Queens County, New York at Jamaica, New York. She stated that she was a widow, her husband's name having been HERMANN DUMONT, whom she married August 2, 1898 at British Guiana. HERMANN DUMONT was born in 1866 in British Guiana and died 1908 in Guatemala, British Honduras and had never been in the United States. One child, Mrs. HERMINA A HUISWOUD, resided with her. Her last foreign address was noted as Georgetown, British Guiana and reflected that she lawfully entered the United States for permanent residence at New York City on November 5, 1919 on the SS KORONA.

The records reflected the Declaration of Intention #102420, filed December 4, 1925 in the United States District Court of the Eastern Pistrict of New York, Brooklyn, New York, for HILDA MILLICENT SPENCER, housewife, 15 St. Marks Place, Brooklyn, New York. This Declaration stated she entered the United States at New York City under the name HILDA M. OUDKERK on November 5, 1919 on the SS KORONA. She was described as having been born at Georgetown, British Guiana, August 8, 1898; married to WILLIAM SPENCER on October 16, 1925 at Bronx, New York; and there were no children. Her last foreign residence was noted as Georgetown, British Guiana. She stated that her husband was born in Georgetown, British Guiana, March 15, 1900 and had entered the United States at New York City on May 22, 1923.

The witnesses to the above Petition were CLAUDE M. MC KENZIF, Clerk, 49 East 99th Street, New York City and CHARLE GREIG, Clerk, 422 Willis Avenue, New York City. The Petition for Naturalization, # 173787, was filed November 7, 1932 at United States District Court, Eastern District of New York, Brooklyn, New York. There was no notice of any Certificate of Naturalization having been issued for HILDA MILLICENT SPENCER.

Communist Activity and Contacts

that HERMIE DUMONT, also known as HERMIE HUISWOOD, had been a Communist Party member since 1926 and had toured the world as an international Communist courier with her husband, OTTO HUISWOOD. According to the informant, the subject and her husband have worked in Hamburg, Germany; Haiti; England; France and Moscow, Russia. The informant advised that the subject was used by the Communists in Moscow to spy on other negro Communists of whom they were not certain as to Party activities and sympathies.

This informant also furnished information on July 18, 1944 that on one occasion he saw the subject in the Lenin School in Moscow. He has also reported that she frequented the New York State and National Headquarters of the Communist Party from 1936 to 1942 and that in 1940 and 1941 she served as the

Executive Secretary of a Communist Party unit located at the corner of 125th Street and 8th Avenue, New York City.

The Communist Party, USA, has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The International Workers Order (IWO)

Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that HD DUMONT of 354 St. Nicholas Avenue, New York City, was a member of the TWO in 1941.

known reliability, furnished a list of prize-winning recruiters of IWO members in a recruiting drive which ended on May 31, 1943. H. DUMONT of Lodge #691 appeared on this list.

On April 17, 1950 T-3 furnished a list of members of IWO Lodge #691. located in Harlem, New York City, which contained the name of HERMIE HULSWOUD, born in 1905. On January 30, 1911 this informant furnished another list of the members of IVO Lodge #691 which also contained the name of HERMIE HULSWOUD.

The International Workers Order has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

George Washington Carver School

May 22, 1945 Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, supplied a list of officers of the George Washington Carver School in Harlem, New York City, for the spring term of May and June, 1945. HERMIE DUMONT appeared on this list as an Administrative Assistant and was also cited as an instructor in the course entitled, "Colonial Peoples".

A December 29, 1945 edition of the "People's Voice" contained a group picture of some of the faculty members of

the Carver School; included in the photograph was HERMI DUMONT.

On November 4, 1947 Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, furnished a list of members of the Board of Directors of the George Washington Carver School for 1947. HERMIE DUMONT was listed as an Assistant Director under the heading Administrative Directors.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, has advised that up until December, 1947 the "People's Voice" was regarded as a Communist dominated publication. However, with the expulsion of former National Committeeman of the Communist Party, and the dismissal of other Communist Party members of the newspaper by MAX YERGAN, the "People's Voice" endeavored to be non-partisan and non-political in character. With the issue of April 24, 1948 the "People's Voice" ceased publication and according to Confidential Informant T-6 it is now bankrupt.

The George Washington Carver School has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Negro Labor Victory Committee

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that HERMINA DUMONT of 67 West 125th Street, New York City, was a member of the Negro Labor Victory Committee in 1944.

The Negro Labor Victory Committee has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.



Her address was 408 West 128th Street, New York City, apartment 20 and her Social Security Number was 070-12-8844.

payroll section, Sydenham Hospital, Manhattan Avenue, New York, stated that the hospital records showed that the subject begancemployment under the name of HERMIE DUMONT as a clerk on October 20. 1947, but that no termination date was on file. expressed the opinion, based upon the sketchy record, that

expressed the opinion, based upon the sketchy record, that the subject was undoubtedly a temporary employee who had worked for a period of from one to two months. DUMONT listed her residence as 408 West 128th Street, New York City.

Informant T-11, of known reliability that her usual occupation was that of a secretary doing odd jobs and that her last employment was with Camp Sherwood, former resort hotel located in the vicinity of Monticello, New York, where she had worked until approximately October of 1948.

History of Travel Abroad

The records of the Passport Division, Department of State, reflect that HERMINIA HUISWOUD was issued passport number 164091 on February 14, 1930 for her intended stay of one year in the British West Indies and Dutch Guiana. Her permanent residence at this time was 2800 Bronx Park East, New York, New York. This passport was renewed February 10, 1932 for two years by the American Consulate, Berlin, Germany.

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Mer application for renewal disclosed she was residing in Moscow, USSR and that she had resided in Moscow from December 15, 1930 to February 9, 1932 and in Berlin from February 9, 1932 to the date of the renewal, February 10, 1932.

On April 27, 1934 HERMINIA HUISWOUD was issued passport number 93029 for a proposed one-year stay in the British
West Indies for the purpose of "health". Her residence at
this time was indicated to be 48-59 37th Street, Long Island,
New York. Her application for this passport reflected that
she had resided in Germany, France, Switzerland and USSR from
December 30, 1933 to February 16, 1934.

On the basis of information concerning the activities of the subject and her husband as furnished by the Division of European Affairs, on January 31, 1935 a refusal notice was placed in Mrs. HUISWOUD's passport record on February 4, 1935 for the reason. "Husband is active Communist".

On April 24, 1936 her passport was renewed by the American Consulate in Paris for two years to expire April 27, 1938. On April 29, 1938 she was issued passport number 811E205873 by the American Consulate in Paris for travel in all countries except Spain. Her legal residence in the United States was indicated to be 271 Clifton Place, Brooklyn, New York.

On September 1, 1949 passport number 137005 was issued in the United States to HERMINA ALICIA HUISWOUD. This passport was limited valid for one year and restricted for travel in the Netherlands only. In her application for this passport Mrs. HUISWOUD stated that she was born October 8, 1905 in New Amsterdam, British Guiana. She immigrated to the United States on November 11, 1919 and resided continuously in the United States from 1919 to 1930 and from 1938 to 1939 in New York, New York. She was naturalized before the Supreme Court of New York at Bronx, New York on January 17, 1928 under Certificate of Naturalization number 2703971.

HERMINA HUISWOUD indicated that her permanent residence was 408 West 128th Street, apartment 20, New York





City and that she intended to depart from New York City on October 13, 1949 aboard the SS VEENDAM for a proposed one-year stay in the Netherlands to join her husband and visit relatives.

The subject pointed out that she was married September 30, 1926 to OTTO HUISWOUD, who was born in 1896 at Paramaribo, Dutch Guiana, and who was residing in Amsterdam, Holland. Mrs. HUISWOUD further informed that her parents, HERMAN and ALICE DUMONT, were both born in British Guiana and were deceased. She reported that she had resided in France from November, 1936 to October, 1938; in the Netherlands from June, 1934 to July, 1936 and in France from 1932 to February, 1934.

In a dispatch dated September 7, 1950 the American Consulate in Amsterdam advised the Passport Division that Mrs. HUISWOUD appeared at that Consulate on September 7, 1950 and requested a renewal of her passport number 137005 which was issued valid only for travel in the Netherlands and the necessary countries en route.

The Consulate reported that Mrs. HUISWOUD's passport number 137005 bore evidence that she had traveled in France, Italy and Switzerland, in addition to the Netherlands and that she alleged she was wholly unaware of the limitations of her passport's validity and the reasons therefore. Mrs. HUISWOUD also informed the Consulate that she was married to a Netherlands subject and did not plan to return to the United States in the near future.

On September 29, 1950 the Passport Division of the State Department advised the American Consulate, Amsterdam, that in view of the violation of restrictions contained in Mrs. HUISWOUD's passport, it could not be amended or extended and instructed the Consulate to send her passport to the Department of State in Washington, D. C. The Consulate was further instructed that in the event HERMINA HUISWOUD applied for further passport facilities that her application was to be referred to the Department of State. It was requested that full information concerning her activities since she went abroad and her contemplated travel plans be referred to the Department of State.



HERMINA HUISWOUD's passport number 137005 was forwarded and is being retained in the files of the Passport Division, Department of State, Washington, D. C.

The records of Immigration and Naturalization Service, New York City, reflect that HERMINA HUISWOUD, age 44, departed from New York City for Rotterdam, Holland aboard the SS VEENDAM of the Holland American Line on October 13, 1949. She traveled on United States passport number 137005. It is noted that she intended to remain abroad indefinitely. The subject listed her United States address as 408 West 128th Street, New York City.

OTTO EDUARD GERARDUS MAJELLA HUISWOOD, was., husband of subject

The records of the State Department contained a dispatch received from the American Embassy at London, England on June 28, 1938 stating that, "OTTO EDWARD HUISWOUD, alias CHARLES WOODSON is a negro native of Dutch Guiana, born in Surinam, October 28, 1893; he travels on a Dutch passport and his wife, HERMINA A. HUISWOUD (nee DUMONT), travels on an American passport. In 1923, HUISWOUD was National Organizer of the African Blood Brotherhood with headquarters in New York. In 1928 he was elected alternate member of the Executive Committee of the Communist International and in 1929 as charter member of the Communist Party, Boston delegation. He signed an appeal sent by the National Convention of the Communist Party of the USA to Moscow. In 1931 HUISWOUD was working in the Negro Bureau of the Red International of Labor Unions, Moscow, and in 1933 he was sent from Moscow to Paris to take over the production of the 'Negro Worker'. HUISWOUD is known to have definite connections with Jamaica. In 1929 he attended the Universal Negro Improvement Association Conference there as delegate from the USA and later started a Jamaican Trades or Labor Union, which subsequently died through lack of support. HUISWOUD has also visited Barbados and other West Indian Islands".

On July 11, 1951 Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, advised that OTTO HUISWOOD was living at Sloestraat 3, Amsterdam, Helland.



Miscellaneous

Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that during 1948 the subject had received treatment at the Bronx Hospital, New York City,

The records of the Board of Election, Manhattan, New York, failed to reflect that the subject voted as HERMIE DUMONT from 408 West 128th Street, New York City, for the years 1941 through 1950.

In March, 1949 the abject advised Confidential Informant T-II that was residing with her at 408 West 128th/Street.

In 1928 he was taken to Russia by his mother and received 12 years education in that country. From May, 1945 to January of 1947 he served in the United States Army. He has been engaged on occasions as a speaker by the National Council of American Soviet Friendship in New York City and also at the George Washington Carver School, New York City.

The National Council of American Soviet Friendship has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The following Confidential Informants, of known reliability, have an acquaintance with Communist Party activities in the greater New York City area, but were unable to furnish any specific information concerning this subject: Confidential Informants T-15, T-16, T-17, T-18, T-19, T-20, T-21, T-22 and T-23.

A national stop notice has been placed with the United States Customs and a national lookout notice with Immigration and Naturalization Service against the subject's return to the United States.

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

Weks'ago of the death of Otto Huiswoud, a Negro charter member of the CPUSA, in The Netherlands, but delayed informing you, until I could get information of the and cause of his passing However, an airmail letter to his widow, Mrs. Hermie Huiswoud, Leimiunderstraat 19:113 Ainsterdam, W. Holland, has brought no results to date, and I have decided not to delay the matter any further.

Here are a few brief biographical notes. Elling to the

Otto Huiswoud, a charter member of the CPUSA; origin. ally from Dutch Guiana; of Negro-Dutch ancestry, took over the chairmanship of the international Trade: Union: Committee after James W. Ford, about 1932

Huiswoud was a printer by trade. He came to N.Y. during the First World War. Towards the end of that war, he became active in the Harlem branch of the old Socialist party, and was one of a group of young Negroes, including Richard S. Moore and Lovette Forte Whiteman, who lateraleft that party to join the CP. He was an associate of Cyril Briggs: in the African Blood Brotherhood, contributing to its organ, "The Crusader," and also to "The Messenger."

He was a delegate from the CPUSA to the 4th Congress of the Communist International along with the Negro poet, Claude McKay who was a fraternal delegate. He later became the first Negro member of the Central Committee of the CPUSA and an alternate member of the

Returning to the U.S., he played a leading role in Nego and participated in the organization of the American Negro Congress in 1925

He returned to Moscow in 1929 or 1930 to intenational work in the CI as its representative to the South African Co, there he re-

then became chairman of the Hamburg Committee about 1932. and continued as chairman of this body until its dissolution at the beginning of World War II. He then returned to the U.S. for a brief period, then went back to Dutch Guiana where, as a result of his anti-imperialist activities, he was thrown into a concentration camp by the Dutch colonial. ists, where he was incarcerated for about two years.

After his release at the end of the war, Huiswoud was refused re-entry into the U.S. He then went to Holland where he had relatives and was later joined by his wife, Hermie Huiswoud, who for several years, worked under Cyrix Briggs as a member of the start of the Crusader News Agency.

While in Moscow in 1922, both Huiswoud and McKay visited Lenin, who was then suffering from his last illness at his summer home outside Moscow. Lenin... is said to have expressed keen interest in the Negro Question in the U.S. and to have referred

his visitors to his work, "The Development of Capitalism in American Agriculture," where he dealt with the South and the Negro Question, and to have expressed the intention of further expolring the question.

Reference is made to SAC letter, Number 60, dated June 16, 1951, transmitting to each Office a summary dated April 24, 1951, concerning the Lenin School. Also transmitted to each Office as an enclosure to the SAC letter was an alphabetical list of those individuals who have been reported to have attended the Lenin School.

As a supplement to the above, there is attached, for each Office receiving copies of this letter, an enclosure containing a summary of the information available concerning the courses of instruction given at the Lenin School, the confidential informants and sources available, and a list of those individuals who have reportedly attended the Lenin School. For your assistance in referring to this material, the enclosure has been broken down into three sections as follows:

Section 1 (Pages 1 through 14):

This Section contains a summary of the additional data available in Bureau files concerning the courses of instruction given at the Lenin School and the revolutionary nature of the subjects that were taught in the School.

Section 2 (Pages 15 through 21):

This Section contains background data concerning the available confidential informants, confidential sources, and identity of other witnesses, all of whom have attended the Lenin School and are in a position to furnish information concerning it. It is believed that the identifying data set for the will assist each Office in determining the extent of an informant's knowledge concerning the Lenin School, as well as his

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knowledge of over-all Communist activities. It will be noted that the period of each informant's attendance at the Lenin School is set forth in order to assist each Office in setting forth leads for interview purposes.

Section 3 (Pages 22 through 101):

This Section contains the supplemental alphabetical summary of those persons who have reportedly attended the Lenin School. It contains the name, aliases, Bureau file number, Office of Origin file number, and identifying data concerning each individual. The identifying data set forth herein should not be considered as a complete summary of the person's Communist Party activity. The identifying data is set forth herein to assist each Office in identifying those who attended the Lenin School, when conducting interviews with graduates of this School. Where mention is made in this Section that a photograph is available, this refers to the fact that a photograph is available in the files of the Office of Origin and the individual case file at the Bureau.

The Bureau desires that additional witnesses be developed to show that those who attended the Lenin School were taught courses or received assignments in respionage, counterespionage, or sabotage tactics in an effort to bring the Lenin School within the purview of Section 20 (a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950. Each Field Office should conduct all investigations with this thought in mind. For your information, the Bureau has furnished a copy of the summary memorandum of April 24, 1951, to the Criminal Division, and a copy of Section 1, pages 1 through 14, of this attachment has been made available to the Criminal Division.

All Offices receiving copies of this letter are instructed as follows:

(1) The alphabetical list dated April 24, 1951, previously furnished each Office, together with Section 3 attached hereto, should be carefully reviewed. This review should be conducted in an effort to identify those whose first, last or Communist Party name only is known, as well as to identify those on whom no paragraph of background data has been reported herein. Section 3 sets forth background data on those who are subjects of main case files in the Bureau and where background information was readily available in the Bureau's files.

- (2) Each Office should make certain when an individual is identified as having received training at the Lenin School that a separate case file is opened and a thorough investigation conducted in accordance with Section 87C4, page 23B, of the Manual of Instructions.
- (3) Each Office should analyze the individual case file on each subject who has attended the Lenin School for the purpose of seeing that data concerning his or her attendance has been fully developed. During the course of these individual file reviews you should give consideration to interviewing every student who attended the Lenin School where it is possible to do so under existing regulations relating to interviews with security subjects. In these instances where an interview is being recommended a letter should be directed to the Bureau captioned under the name of the individual subject.
- (4) Each Office should make certain that data concerning the courses taught and revolutionary nature of the Lenin School presently appearing in your files, as well as the material developed in future interviews of subjects in individual cases, is reported in the Lenin School file. Each Office should make available to the Bureau and the New York Office any data appearing in your files concerning the Lenin School where same has not been previously reported. It is the mesponsibility of each Office to see that data concerning the Lenin School obtained in the future is made available to the Bureau and the New York Office. This includes designating copies of reports to the New York Office, for the Lenin School file, which contain the results of interviews with individual subjects who have attended the Lenin School.

In view of the fact that the majority of the American students who attended the Lenin School now reside in the New York area, the New York Office is being designated as the Office of Origin. It will be the responsibility of the New York Office to make certain that over-all data concerning activity at the Lenin School, the courses taught, and the revolutionary nature of such instruction as developed in the interviews are properly summarized and reported in the Lenin School file in report form suitable for dissemination.

The Bureau has noted from interviews with former students, particularly Confidential Informants, that due to the lapse of time since they have attended the Lenin School they have been unable, in most instances, to recall more than a very few names. It is believed that by carefully reviewing the material attached here to and familiarizing yourself with it that additional data may be obtained concerning the instructions given, and the identity of other students may be obtained, particularly those whose first, last or Communist Party name is known. It is possible that the whereabouts of some of the former students heretofore unknown may be revealed.

Each Office should promptly advise the Bureau by letter captioned in the Lenin School file when the above instructions have been complied with. This letter should set forth the name and Bureau file number of those subjects recommended for interview.

PAUL CROUCH - INFORMANT INTERNAL SECURITY - R SECURITY MATTER - C

By memorandum to the Director dated December 9, captioned "World Tourist." Investigations Division, Immigration and Naturalization Service, furnished information and to the effect that Paul Crouch, a consultant for the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Washington, D. C., had submitted a memorandum dated October 8, 1952, to Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D. C., advising that from an examination of passport photographs at the Central Office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Crouch had been able to identify 105 Communist Party

members or former Communist Party members known to him personally. Crouch specified that some were out of the Communist Party or that the present attitude of others was in doubt and they may be working with agencies of the Soviet government.

Blank memoranda have been prepared concerning each person identified, and two copies of each of the se ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED memoranda are attached.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the copies of the memoranda be routed to the Supervisor handling the respective case files for necessary action. It is suggested that one copy of each memorandum be furnished the office of origin in each case. In some cases, it may be desirable to interview Crouch for additional information concerning the extent of his association with the individual mentioned.

Paul Crouch, employed as a consultant for the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Washington, D. C., and a former Communist Party member, advised the Immigration and Naturalization Service by memorandum dated October 8, 1952, that from an examination of passport photographs at the Immigration and Naturalization Service Central Office, he was able to identify the following person as a Communist Party member or former member known to him personally:

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
